

Wagon Caused Suit

The other case called before Judge Broomall was that brought by J. T. Swarthy against F. D. Worrell. It appears that Worrell, who is a milk dealer, had his wagon so badly damaged that it was worthless and while a new one was being built for him, he borrowed one from Swarthy, who was given to understand that the new wagon would soon be ready. The plaintiff claims that Worrell used the wagon for eight months, despite the fact that he was asked frequently to return it, and when he did return it the wagon was no longer of any use, being worn out. Worrell said that he was given permission to use the wagon until his wagon was ready, although he admitted that he led Swarthy to believe that his new wagon would soon be ready, as he said that he believed that it was about completed. He said that he used the wagon from May to the last of September, only, and that he spent \$20 to have repairs made to it; that when he returned it to the owner it was as good as when he got it.

The case of J. T. Swarthy against F. D. Worrell which was tried before Judge Broomall yesterday was given over to the jury this morning. This was the last case listed for the present week and all other jurors not figuring in the case were discharged. There will be court next week.
